Are you passionate about the role that energy plays in economic development, politics, or the environment? Do you have an idea for how we can improve energy policy at home or abroad? Submit your proposal to the Tufts Energy Conference *Energy Policy Challenge!*

The Tufts Energy Conference is an annual event that brings together professionals, students, and experts to discuss critical global energy issues. This year, the 11th conference will explore *The Geopolitics of Energy*, with discussion centering on how energy developments at the global, regional, and national levels are shaping international politics and markets.

To showcase student research and generate thoughtful proposals for new energy policies, we are seeking memo-style policy papers on a variety of topics, including:

- International Energy Governance
- Renewable Energy
- Conventional Energy
- Carbon Markets
- Biofuels and Transportation Fuels

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: February 15, 2016

ELIGIBILITY: Students currently enrolled in an academic program at the undergraduate or graduate level (including PhD students).

REQUIREMENTS:

- Proposals should be 2,000 – 3,000 words (5 to 7 pages) in length, formatted as a policy memo, and directed toward a specific individual or organization
- Memos should identify a specific energy challenge, propose a solution, and present analysis supporting this recommendation
- Proposals must be in English and include references
- Submissions should also include a CV or resume in English
- Proposals should be submitted to: Policy@TuftsEnergyConference.com

PRIZE: The winning submission will be announced during the Tufts Energy Conference on March 6, 2016. The winner will receive a prize of \$500 and his or her proposal will be published on the website of The Fletcher School's Center for International Environment and Resource Policy.
